CONCERNING

THE IMPOSITION OF SAFEGUARD MEASURE IMPORT DUTY ON THE IMPORT OF
ZINC WIRES

BY THE GRACE OF GOD ALMIGHTY
MINISTER OF FINANCE,

Considering

- a. that based on the investigation by the Indonesian Trade Safeguard Committee, it is evidenced that there was an import surge of zinc wires which resulted in serious losses (injuries) in domestic industries;
- b. that in the effort of following up the results of investigation as referred to in letter a, the Minister of Trade, through Letter number: 989/M-DAG/SD/7/2010 dated July 20, 2010, Number: 1669/M-DAG/11/2010 dated November 3, 2010, and Number: 1855/M-DAG/SD/12/2010 dated December 20, 2010, delivered a proposal on the imposition of Safeguard Measure Import Duty on the import of zinc wires;
- c that based on the provisions in Article 21 of Presidential Decree number 84 year 2002 on Safeguard Measures to Domestic Industries for the Impact of Import Surges, safeguard measures shall remain definable in the form of Import Duty by the Minister of Finance;
- d that based on considerations as referred to in letter a, letter b, and letter c, and in the effort of implementing the provision in Article 23D item (2) of Act Number 10 Year 1995 on Customs Clearance as amended by Act Number 17 Year 2006, it is necessary to stipulate a Regulation of the Minister of Finance on the Imposition of Safeguard Measure Import Duty on the Import of Zinc Wires;

In View of

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DECIDES:

To Stipulate : THE REGULATION OF MINISTER OF FINANCE ON THE IMPOSITION OF SAFEGUARD MEASURE IMPORT DUTY ON THE IMPORT OF ZINC WIRE ROPES.

Article 1

The import of zinc wires, namely wires of iron or non-alloy steel, plated or coated with zinc, containing by weight less than 0.25% of carbon, except British Weight Gauge (BWG) measure of more than 20 or diameter of less than 0.89 mm and diameter of 1.9 mm to 4.2 mm with zinc coating of above 240 gr/m², included in tariff heading ex 7217.20.10.00, shall be subject to Safeguard Measure Import Duty.

Article 2

The Safeguard Measure Import Duty as referred to in Article 1 shall be imposed for three (3) years with the following conditions:

No	Period	Safeguard Measure Import Duty
1	1 st year, with period of one (1) year from the promulgation of Regulation of the Minister of Finance.	Rp. 6.658 /kg
2	2 nd year, with period of one (1) year from the expiry date of the first year period.	Rp. 5.643 /kg
3	3 rd year, with period of one (1) year from the expiry date of the second year period.	Rp. 4.629 /kg

Article 3

The Safeguard Measure Import Duty as referred to in Article 1 shall be imposed on the importation from all countries, except on zinc wires manufactured by the countries as listed in appendix of this Regulation of the Minister of Finance, which constitutes an integral part of this Regulation of the Minister of Finance.

Article 4

(1) The Imposition of Safeguard Measure Import Duty as referred to in Article 1 shall be:



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- a. additional general import duty (Most Favored Nation); or
 - b. additional preference import duty based on the applicable schemes of international goods trading agreement in the case that the import is carried out from the countries included in the said schemes of international goods trading agreement and complies with the provisions in the schemes of international goods trading agreement.
- (2) In the case that the provisions in the schemes of international goods trading agreement are not fulfilled, the imposition of Safeguard Measure Import Duty on the importation from the countries included in the schemes of international goods trading agreement, as referred to item (1) letter b, shall be additional general import duty (Most Favored Nation).

Article 5

In the case of the import of zinc wires originating from the countries excluded from the imposition of Safeguard Measure Import Duty as referred to in Article 3 and originating from the countries having trading agreement with Indonesia as referred to in Article 4 item (1) letter b, the importer shall be obliged to submit Certificate of Origin over.

Article 6

The provisions concerning the imposition of tariff of Safeguard Measure Import Duty as referred to in Article 2 shall be fully applicable on the import of goods the intended import customs notification of which has obtained registration number from the Customs Office overseeing the port of entry from the date of enactment of this Regulation of the Minister of Finance.

Article 7

1. The Regulation of the Minister of Finance shall come into force from the date of promulgation.
2. The Regulation of the Minister of Finance shall be valid for three (3) years from the date of enactment of this Regulation of the Minister of Finance as referred to in item 1.

For public cognizance, this Regulation of the Minister of Finance shall be promulgated by placing it in State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia.
